## CARAVAN MET AT SAUGUS

### Hundred Cars Bearing Representatives of Local Republican Bodies Escort Coolidge Delegation

The Coolidge-Dawes Plymouth Caravan, which has toured the Lincoln highway from the birthplace of President Coolidge, was met at Saugus yesterday by an escort of more than 100 automobiles filled with representatives from various Republican clubs of the county.

From Saugus the entire procession passed through San Fernando, Burbank and Glendale, where short stops were made and speeches were delivered. The members of the caravan arrived in Los Angeles late yesterday afternoon, and immediately went to their hotel, to prepare for their appearance at the Trinity Auditorium.

The caravan, which has been in California four days, left Fresno at dawn yesterday, made a halt at Bakersfield at noon, and then proceeded toward Los Angeles.

#### GROUPS REPRESENTED

The escort assembled at the Coolidge-Dawes headquarters in Glendale and fell into line, headed by a squad of county motorcycle officers under Capt. Cannon. At the head of the line were Ralph Arnold and W. E. Evans, chairman and first vice-chairman, respectively, of the Los Angeles Republican County Central Committee, who welcomed the members of the caravan. Behind them came cars from Los Angeles Republican headquarters, and from the Coolidge-Dawes clubs of Santa Monica, Venice, Glendale, Long Beach, Burbank, San Fernando, Pasadena and Pomona. The Republican Study Club, the Republican Veterans

League, the Young Men's Republican League and the Colored Citizens' Committee were represented by cars. A band in a bus enlivened the way.

In one of the leading cars was George A. Billings, who represents the Great Emancipator in the motion picture "Abraham Lincoln" now at the Criterion Theater. Mr. Billings was costumed as in the film. At Glendale he addressed the crowd in the interests of the present Republican candidate.

#### ON WAY OVER MONTH

In the caravan were A. W. Jefferis, former Congressman from Nebraska, M. B. Pitt, Speaker of the House of Representatives of Iowa, A. W. Jefferis, Jr., William Wallace, O. S. Nussbaum, John P. Cowan and E. C. Hoch.

The caravan, traveling in five automobiles, has been on the road since September 9, last, when it left Plymouth, Vt., the home town of the President. The purpose of the tour is to acquaint the people with the intimate details of the President's character and his principles.

Today the caravan will take up its tour again, going to San Francisco by way of the coast highway. Santa Barbara will be reached at noon, according to plans last night.
