

A BILL

1. Honoring the day a state was admitted into the Union

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That there is hereby established the flying of the state flag of each state in the Union on the anniversary of their being admitted into the Union.

Sec. 2. As a precedent was set by President Coolidge on September 9th, 1924 when he had the state flag of California flown over the White House and expressed the wish that this be done on the succeeding nines of September.

Sec. 3. As California was the first state to have her flag flown over the White House, thereby establishing the opportunity for each state to have their flag flown on their Admission Day.

Sec. 4. Accordingly highlighting each state's Admission Day, this would give the President and the state Governor the opportunity to meet and discuss issues concerning their state.
