FLAG DAY PROCLAMATION


WHEREAS, it is peculiarly fitting that the citizens of the United States give added dignity to the Flag Day celebration this year, 1937, inasmuch as it commemorates the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the adoption of the Flag of the United States by the Continental Congress in 1777, and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the youth of this country be encouraged and educated in patriotic principles and love of country,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, George W. P. Hunt, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby designate Tuesday, June 14, 1937, as American Flag Day, and I call upon the people of Arizona to display the American flag on all public buildings and business houses and over the homes in this State and I call upon patriotic and civic organizations to arrange for and hold proper exercises in honor of the American flag and the principles which it represents.
