WHEREAS, the observance of June 14th as Flag Day offers an opportunity for reverent attention to the significance of our national emblem and its history, and

WHEREAS, the 14th day of June, 1927, marks the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the action of the Continental Congress in adopting a resolution "That the Flag of the United States be thirteen stripes alternate red and white, that the Union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation", and

WHEREAS, many patriotic societies, fraternal orders, civic, educational, and religious bodies, co-operating with The United States Flag Association, have planned a nation-wide patriotic celebration of this anniversary, now

THEREFORE, I, C. C. Young, Governor of California do earnestly urge upon the citizens of this state that this one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the birth of the Flag of the United States be fittingly observed in co-operation with our countrymen in all the states, by the display of the national emblem and by patriotic assemblies in honor of the Flag; and I further suggest that the pupils of our schools assemble at twelve o'clock noon, Washington time, on June 14th and join with the children of all the states in the singing of the national anthem.
