Proclamation.

The present year marks the sesqui-centennial of the adoption of the flag of the United States. That flag has become the symbol of the greatest nation in the world and of the fullest, finest freedom ever enjoyed by man. Thousands of heroes have died in its defense, and millions of men and women deem it their proudest privilege to support the principles it symbolizes.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Theodore Christianson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate the week of June 8, 1927,


FLAG WEEK,

and do proclaim Tuesday, June 14, 1927,

FLAG DAY;

and do earnestly suggest and request that on every day during said Flag Week, the flag of our country be displayed from public buildings, places of business and homes; that during said week the school children, wherever schools are in session, be instructed not only in the approved ways of displaying the flag and showing proper respect therefor, but in the ideals of liberty and the principles of government which it exemplifies; and that on said Flag Day, Tuesday, June 14, the people generally, in their respective communities, assemble to commemorate by fitting and suitable ceremonies the one hundred fiftieth anniversary of the adoption of the flag of the United States and to dedicate themselves anew to the ideals, traditions and institutions for which it stands.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be hereto affixed at the Capitol in the City of Saint Paul, this 2nd Day of June, A.D. 1927
