

BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MONTANA--A PROCLAMATION.


This year is an important one in the history of the American flag, as it marks the sesquicentennial of the adoption of the emblem of the Nation, the emblem for the preservation of which our people have endured hardships and made sacrifices without number. It is therefore most appropriate for us to give more than passing thought to the occasion and all that it means to us as a people.

Wherefore I, J. E. Erickson, Governor of the State of Montana, do hereby designate and set apart the week of June 8-14, 1927, as Flag week, and do proclaim Tuesday, June 14, as Flag Day.

It is to be hoped that during this period the flag may be displayed from public buildings, business places and homes; that special instruction be given in our schools concerning the flag and the ideals for which it stands; and that on Flag Day patriotic exercises be held in adequate commemoration of the flag's adoption, when we may rededicate ourselves to the ideals, traditions and principles of which that flag is the symbol.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed.
