A PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR

The passing months have again brought close to us one of the vitally important anniversaries of our Nation's history, and that fitting observance may be made thereof, I, F. B. Balzar, Governor of Nevada do hereby designate and proclaim Tuesday, June 14, 1927 as Flag Day, that being the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the birth of our immortal Flag.

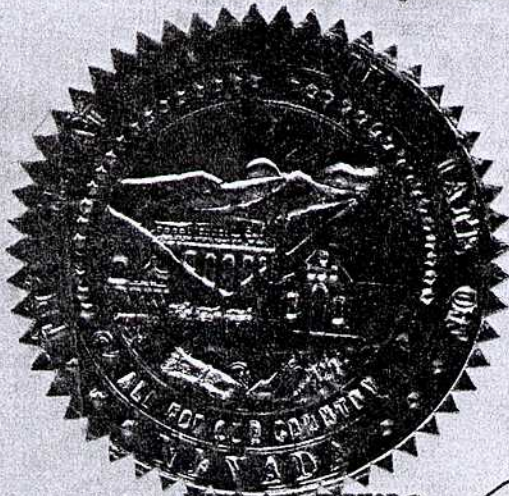
I request that our National Emblem be displayed on that Day over the school houses and our public buildings as well as upon the homes and places of business of our citizens.

That if it be possible the teachers and parents of our State assemble the children in the school houses and homes--where the schools are closed--on June 14th next Flag Day at exactly twelve o'clock noon Washington time or at nine a. m. Pacific time and with appropriate exercises and addresses cause to be sung "The Star Spangled Banner" in unison with the tens of thousands of others who will be likewise singing at the same moment throughout our Country in commemoration of this great Day.

Let our hearts like our voices be turned to Independence Hall, Philadelphia where our immortal Republic was born, as they chant the deathless anthem in praise of the Emblem of our glorious Nation.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of the State of Nevada. Done at Carson City, this 26th day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.
