FLAG DAY, JUNE 14th.


On June 14, 1777, the Continental Congress passed the following resolution:

"RESOLVED, that the Flag of the thirteen United States of America be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a New Constellation".

With that date and that resolution began the official history of the Stars and Stripes as a living, effective symbol of our Nationality.

June 14, 1927, will mark the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of our Flag, and this sesqui-centennial event in our history deserves general and public recognition.

THEREFORE, I, A. HARRY MOORE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY, do hereby request and urge the citizens of New Jersey to show their honor and respect for our National Flag on this, its one hundred and fiftieth anniversary, by displaying it publicly throughout the State, and holding appropriate celebrations.
