FLAG DAY

A PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

June 14, 1927 is the 150th Anniversary of the adoption of the Stars and Stripes as our national emblem, and the United States Flag Association, of which Calvin Coolidge is honorary president, is enlisting the active participation of the various patriotic societies throughout the union in arranging for a fitting celebration of the occasion;

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with custom, and in order that New Mexico may officially take part in the national ceremony of honoring the flag, I, R. C. DILLON, Governor of the State of New Mexico, do hereby proclaim June 14th, 1927 as FLAG DAY in the State of New Mexico.

Let us remember that this flag is a living symbol of a living nation, that it has been our victorious and inspiring vanguard on the field of battle and has never suffered the humiliation of being lowered in defeat; let us familiarize ourselves with its sacred ritual so we will instantly arise to our feet and uncover our heads when it is passing by. All school children should be instructed in the correct use of the flag, and taught that it symbolizes the ideals, principles and institutions of our country. I suggest that on this anniversary the flag be displayed on all public buildings, places of business, city parks and homes. The Stars and Stripes should occupy a place of honor in every home in the land, every day in the year, for it guarantees the safety of our homes and enables us to live in peace and contentment.
