A P R O C L A M A T I O N

It has become an increasingly important annual custom for the people of the United States to observe as Flag Day the anniversary of the adoption of the Stars and Stripes as the emblem of our country. It is altogether fitting and proper that this should be done as an impressive means of bringing fresh to our minds and hearts the immeasurable privileges symbolized by the flag of the United States.

On this day it behooves us all to refresh our understanding and renew our appreciation of the blessings we share under Old Glory. Furthermore, the occasion should be also one for a rededication of our utmost in citizenship for the further advancement of the high purposes of our Nation.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GEORGE H. DERN, Governor of the State of Utah, do set apart and designate Tuesday, June 14, 1927, as

FLAG DAY

and earnestly urge the display of the flag from every home and building, public or private, and suggest that the patriotic people of this state commemorate the day with appropriate exercises wherever possible. Due care should be taken in the proper display of the flag and in the observance of proper respect towards it.
